**Series Passage:** 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 "God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise."

The power of the cross:

I Corinthians 1:18-19 NLT The message of the cross is foolish to those who are headed for destruction! But we who are being saved know it is the very power of God. <sup>19</sup> As the Scriptures say,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise and discard the intelligence of the intelligent."
